



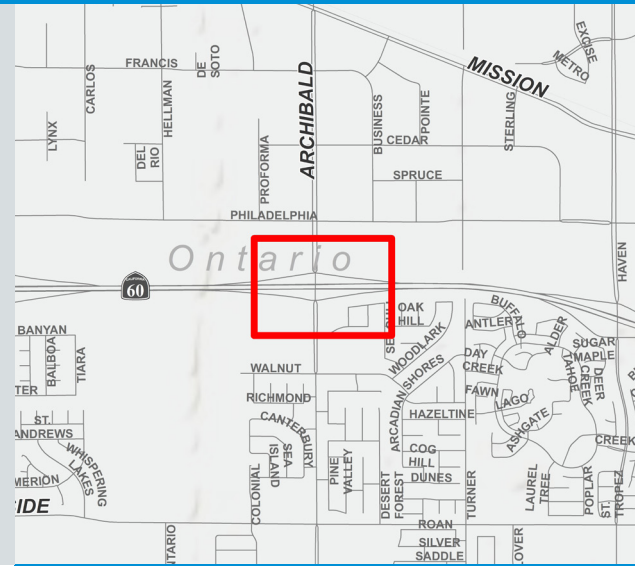

SR 60/ ARCHIBALD AVENUE

Overview

In an effort to improve traffic flow along Archibald Avenue, the San Bernardino County Transportation Authority (SBCTA), in cooperation with the City of Ontario and Caltrans District 8, are reconfiguring the ramps on SR 60 at Archibald Avenue in the City of Ontario and widening Archibald Avenue to increase the left turn capacity. The project will:

- Relieve congestion and improve traffic flow on Archibald Avenue between East Oak Hill Drive and Monticello Place near the SR 60 interchange
- Address increased travel associated with existing and planned development anticipated in the cities of Ontario and Eastvale
- Upgrade pedestrian access via sidewalks, crosswalks, and curb ramps

Frequently Asked Questions

WHEN WILL CONSTRUCTION BEGIN?

Construction began in March 2020.

WHAT CAN I EXPECT DURING CONSTRUCTION?

Construction activities may include structure excavation, roadwork activities, pavement work, traffic shifts, intermittent lane closures, and ramp closures to name a few. Please be aware and use caution throughout the corridor as workers and heavy equipment will be present. You should allow for extra time to reach your destination as you may experience delays. WILL YOU CLOSE RAMPS DURING CONSTRUCTION?

We expect that there will be ramp closures during construction. We will notify you in advance of these closures. During closures, traffic controllers will be onsite. Please use caution when travelling through the corridor and allow for extra time to reach your destination as you may experience delays. Archibald Avenue will remain open at all times with intermittent lane closures at times as needed.

HOW IS THIS PROJECT BEING FUNDED?

Funding is provided by state and local sources including Measure I funds.

We Plan.

The SR 60/Archibald Avenue project was approved in March 2018. The project will be built with state and local (including Measure I) funding. Measure I is the ½ center sales tax collected through San Bernardino County for transportation improvements. Voters first approved the measure in 1989, and overwhelmingly its extension in 2004 with more than 80% voting to extend the measure through 2040. SBCTA administers Measure I revenue and determines which projects receive Measure I funding.

We Build.

Archibald Avenue currently experiences queuing and congestion at the ingress and egress to SR 60 in the City of Ontario, resulting in travel delay to local residents. The condition is expected to continue to decline as existing and planned development in the cities of Ontario and Eastvale continue to rise.

The project will widen Archibald Avenue to include additional left-turn lanes in each direction, additional right-turn pockets approaching the eastbound and westbound on-ramps, and extended left-turn lane storage (queuing) south of the interchange for northbound traffic accessing the westbound on-ramp.

During construction activities may include structure excavation, roadwork activities, pavement work, traffic shifts, intermittent lane closures, and ramp closures. Workers and heavy equipment will be present throughout the project corridor and we ask that you allow for extra time to reach your destination as you may experience delays.
