

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

- 4.2-mile-long underground tunnel connecting Cucamonga Metrolink Station to Ontario International Airport (ONT)
- Travels south along Milliken Avenue, beneath 6th and 4th Streets in the City of Rancho Cucamonga, I-10, and the UPRR in the City of Ontario, and heads west beneath East Airport Drive to connect the Cucamonga Metrolink Station to ONT.
- Three passenger stations: one at Cucamonga Metrolink Station, and two stations would serve ONT within the existing parking lots located across from Terminals 2 and 4.
- Autonomous electric vehicles would enter the main artery tunnel via a ramp from the Cucamonga Metrolink Station.



PURPOSE	NEED
Expand access options to ONT by providing a convenient and direct connection between ONT and the Southern California regional rail network for air passengers and airport employees.	ONT is one of the fastest growing commercial airports in the United States, with 5.6 million annual passengers in 2019. The number of passengers who traveled through ONT in April 2022 was nearly 7% above the April 2019 total, beating pre-pandemic levels for the second straight month.
Encourage a mode shift to transit from single-occupancy vehicles using the surrounding road network for travel to and from ONT.	ONT staffing at its passenger terminals is expected to increase, which will result in increased access needs for airport employees.
Support near-term and long-term projected passenger and job growth at ONT.	No direct, last-mile connections are available between nearby Metrolink stations and ONT.
Support autonomous electric vehicle technology usage for transit projects.	Public transportation is limited to ONT.



PROJECT BENEFITS

- Provide congestion relief and access to affordable transit connection for disadvantaged populations and improve air quality.
- Increase mobility and connectivity for transit riders and improve access to existing transportation service.
- Accommodate future employment and population growth.
- Expand access options to ONT by providing a convenient and direct connection between ONT and Metrolink network for air passengers and employees.



PURPOSE OF CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT (CEQA)

- > **DISCLOSE** reasons for an agency's decision.
- > **PROMOTE** and encourage public participation.
