- Evaluation of four options
- Morgan Ranch option was the most viable
- Least impactful to residents
- Direct route of travel
- Property acquisition and funding is in progress

PUBLIC SAFETY PRIORITIES

- Neither the City of Rancho Cucamonga nor the Fire District have the authority to close Cucamonga Canyon. The U.S. Forest Service has the authority to close Cucamonga Canyon.
- Utilizing the Morgan Ranch property as an entry point provides local control to close access to Cucamonga Canyon during increase concerns of public safety including red flag warnings and flood advisories.
- Improved coordinated management of public safety resources throughout the City's wildland urban interface.
