5 Tips for Getting **Your Hybrid Workers** to Rideshare

Although more and more employers are calling for workers to return to the worksite, that doesn't mean telework is a thing of the past.

In fact, 50% of paid work is still currently done through telecommutingmost through a hybrid schedule.

Hybrid telework arrangements bring advantages to employers in terms of employee retention and happiness. They also bring challenges for managing these workers' special commute needs.

Because hybrid workers spend so much less time commuting overall, it's tempting for them to revert to driving alone on the days they come into the office.

Here, we outline five ways you can help ensure that hybrid workers especially those who used to rideshare pre-pandemic—don't slide back into driving alone:

5 Tips for Getting Your Hybrid Workers to Rideshare

1. Review how you offer benefits — it's no longer "one size fits all" when it comes to commuting.

Whenever possible, allow employees to choose more of a cafeteria style of commute options vs. having to commit to getting to work the same way every day.

If you subsidize the cost of transit, include daily or flex passes as well as monthly passes for those employees who don't commute five days a week.

For employees that vanpool, suggest that employees "share" a seat so the vanpool still meets ridership minimums, even if employees are only coming into work a few days a week.

2. Promote modes that feel less like a waste of valuable time.

Employees got a taste for not sitting in traffic every day, and they have less tolerance for it now. Promote options that can help commuters make better use of their time.

Riding the train or vanpooling allows people to catch up on emails or just relax and unwind. Bicycling lets them combine getting to work with their workout. If they can access carpool lanes, they'll waste less time on the road.

3. Let them know about transit/carpool deals and discounts.

Cost can tempt commuters to give up the solo drive if the deal is good enough, especially with gas prices being so high. Transit agencies often run special promotions on passes, such as OCTA's Savings Pass that offers 40% off fares or Free Ride Fridays on Riverside Transit. Check with your local agency.

Many express toll lanes—including those on the 10, 110, 91 and 15 freeways—allow carpools to ride free or at a discount (passenger requirements vary).

4. It's not just where they work, but *when* that makes a difference in the commute.

Can you flex schedules to make it easier for employees to meet up with carpools or vanpools, or be able to catch a convenient train or commuter bus?

5. Ask employees what would make the commute more bearable.

Whether you set up a formal focus group or simply ask around, you might be surprised at what you learn when you invite feedback.

You may find, for example, that employees would much rather take the train than drive, but the nearest station is too far to walk. That's an opportunity to suggest "last mile" options such as bike share programs or microtransit.

Asking may also help you identify policies in your commute program that need to be tweaked to better meet the needs of hybrid workers—and that can make a big difference in your rideshare rate.

South Coast AQMD to Reinstate Late Fees



South Coast AOMD

Important news if you're required to submit an annual transportation plan to meet South Coast Rule 2202 mandates: As of Jan 1, 2024, the agency will no

longer waive late plan submittal and extension fees.

The fees were temporarily suspended "to accommodate difficult and uncertain conditions being experienced by regulated employers during the time of COVID-19 social distancing measures," according to a South Coast AQMD notice.

Metro's ETC Support Department Gets a New Name



The Metro department that assists employers with managing commute programs now goes by a new name: Commuter Options & Regulatory Compliance Support.

It was previously Regional Rideshare/

Shared Mobility.

"The new name better reflects the many services we offer to Los Angeles County employers and commuters," says Metro Transportation Planning Senior Manager Martin Buford. "Our team works directly with ETCs to help them with their employee commute programs, as well as providing direct support with Rule 2202 South Coast AQMD mandates and local congestion management regulations—including annual AVR survey assistance and processing."

TAP Mobile App Upgrades Now Available



TAP recently added some updates to its app. Among them is a "Fare Capping Status" feature. This lets Metro riders view their fare capping progress towards free rides for the 1-Day and 7-Day cap, right from the app.

Fare capping means that people who pay per ride won't pay a higher rate than those who purchase multi-ride or monthly passes. A TAP card (vs. paying in cash) is required to qualify for fare capping.

More Frequent Service on Metro B and D Subway Lines



Metro recently added more frequent service to the B and D Line subway lines—reducing crowding on trains and allowing riders to get where they're going faster.

On weekdays, trains now run every 12 minutes from about 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. (and 8:15 a.m. to 7 p.m. on weekends).

Where the B and D Lines share a section of track—between Wilshire/Vermont and Union Station—trains run every six minutes at these peak hours.

During non-peak hours trains run every 20 minutes (and every 10 minutes between Wilshire/Vermont and Union Station).

The increase in frequencies is part of ongoing work to restore Metro Rail service to prepandemic levels.

By the end of last year, Metro had hired enough bus operators to return to pre-pandemic bus service levels. This fiscal year, the agency is working to do the same for its rail service, according to **Metro's The Source.**

Metro's monthly bus and rail ridership is now at 76% of its 2019 pre-pandemic level.



ORANGE COUNTY

I-405 Express Lanes Are One Step Closer to Opening

With the recent reopening of the Newland Street Bridge the 18th and final bridge reconstructed as part of the I-405 Improvement Project—the entire project is nearly complete.

A 16-mile stretch of the 405 Freeway between Costa Mesa and the LA County line has been undergoing improvements since 2018.

The project will add one regular lane in each direction as well as express toll lanes.

Construction is expected to be complete by the end of this year.



Bringing Your Bike on OC Bus



Did you know...? All OC Bus vehicles can accommodate up to three bikes. This includes e-bikes, as long as they fit the same profile as a regular bike.

Bikes must fit securely on the bike rack and weigh 55 pounds or less. Bikes/e-bikes are not permitted inside the bus unless they are foldable or it is the last bus trip of the day.

OCTA offers tips for safely loading and unloading bikes, as well as details on specifications at octa.net/bike.

OC Bus Riders Get Free App Upgrade

OC Bus riders can now get a free upgrade to Transit Royale, the premium subscription of the Transit app.

Transit Royale uses real-time information to allow OC Bus riders to plan and track their trips, then view arrival and departure times.

Start a Vanpool with Just 50% Occupancy

As a pilot program starting in 2021, OCTA dropped the minimum ridership to 50% to allow a vanpool to qualify for incentives—including \$400 monthly subsidies.

OCTA recently announced that it will keep the minimum at 50% permanently to make it easier to get vanpools on the road.

To board at no cost, riders will need a Free Ride Friday pass, available via the GoMobile app at riversidetransit.com.


West Valley Connector Groundbreaking

Construction of the West Valley Connector got underway last month. Upon completion, the project will bring a 100% zero-emission bus rapid transit system to the city of Ontario.

The connector will span nearly 20 miles, with 21 stations between Pomona and Rancho Cucamonga—including 3.5 miles of dedicated bus lanes.

In addition to serving Ontario International Airport, it will link to Metrolink and multiple major activity centers, including Ontario Mills and Victoria Gardens.

Free Rides on Veterans Day

To qualify for a free ride, veterans should show their valid veteran's identification to the bus driver upon boarding any participating fixedroute bus service.

Veterans without proper identification will be asked to share their branch, dates and location of service with the bus driver.
