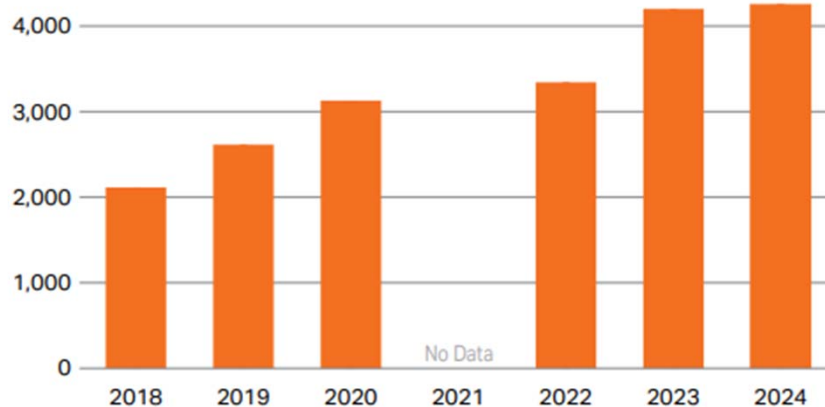

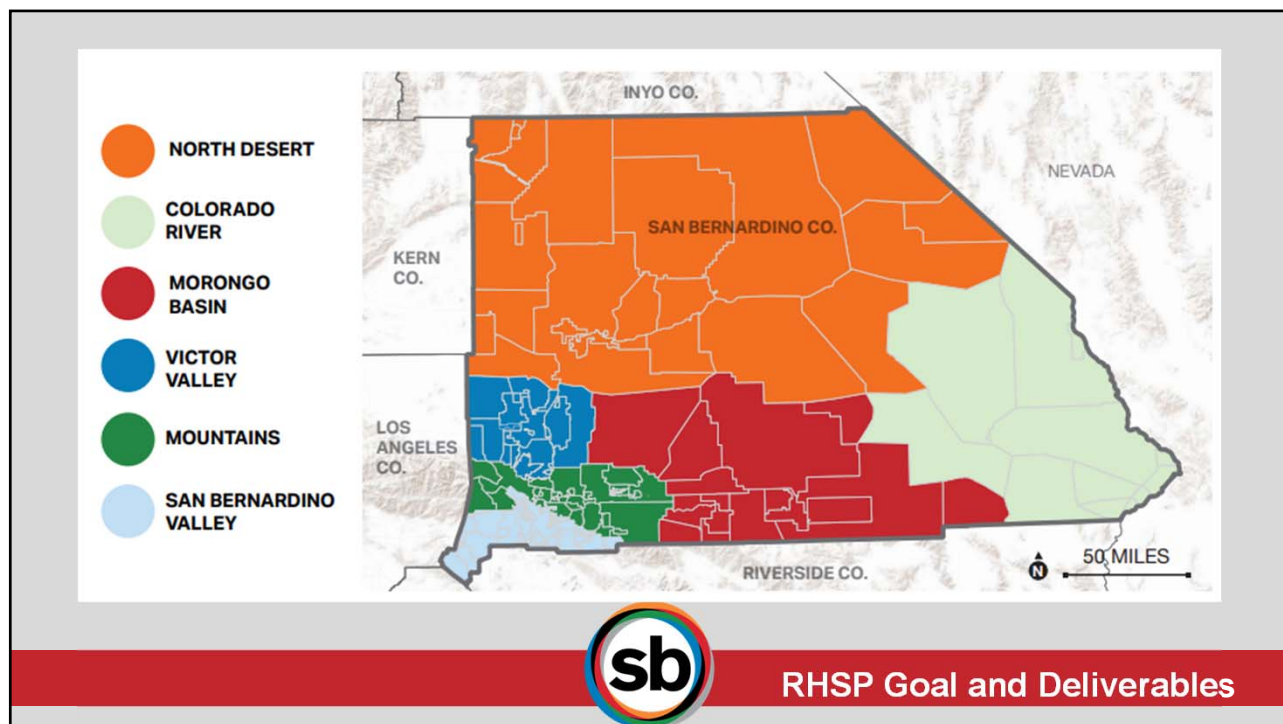
TOTAL NUMBER OF PERSONS COUNTED

- 13 County departments signed Participating Agency Agreement on August 13, 2025

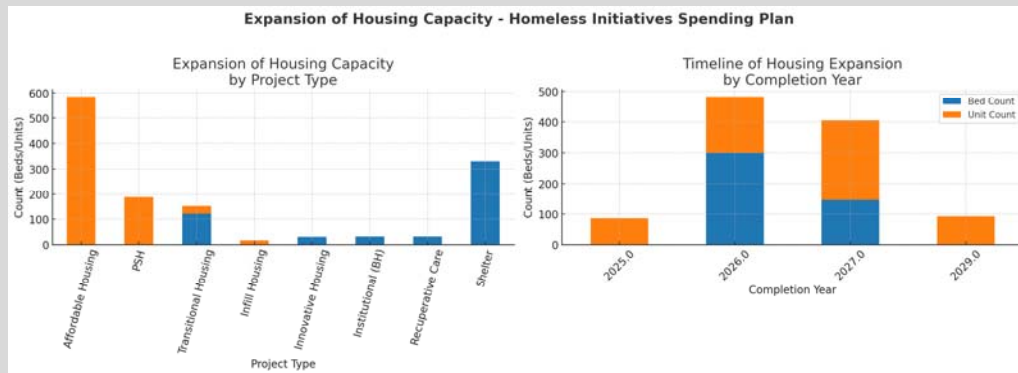

Westend Regional Navigation Center

- ☐ Partnership with eight cities

 - 8 Sobering Center

SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES

City of San Bernardino Partnership

- Largest homeless population in the County (1,535 total, with 981 individuals unsheltered)
- Biweekly Meetings to discuss the issue of homelessness and provide technical support
- Encampment Outreach /Resource Events
- Central Navigation Center

SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES

St. John of God Campus

- Comprehensive treatment campus in Victorville
- Department of Behavioral Health is using grant funding to add:
 - 18-bed adult withdrawal management treatment center
 - 14-bed adolescent psychiatric residential treatment facility
 - 16-bed adolescent residential substance use disorder (SUD) treatment facility
 - 36-beds to the existing 60-bed adult residential SUD treatment center
 - 52 recovery residence beds
 - Community wellness center and an outpatient clinic serving both adults and youth
 - New facilities will collectively serve approximately 1,056 individuals annually.

SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES

Pacific Village Platinum Campus

- Full-service continuum of care campus in the City of San Bernardino
- **Phase I:** 28 interim housing units (completed)
- **Phase II:** Adding 58 permanent supportive housing units, 32 recuperative care beds, a 16-bed facility to provide substance use disorder (SUD) residential treatment for adults. Eight interim housing units will remain from Phase I.
- **Phase III:** Adding another 16-bed SUD residential treatment facility to serve adults.

SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES

Capacity Expansion for Substance Use Disorder Treatment

- Senate Bill (SB) 43 expanded the definition of grave disability to add severe substance use disorder and inability to provide for one's personal safety or necessary medical care, effective April 1, 2025
- In March 2025, the County increased substance use disorder recovery services bed capacity- raising the total from 169 available beds to 303.

SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES

California State University San Bernardino

Homeless Research Project Collaboration to:

1. More effectively characterize the subpopulations of unsheltered individuals in San Bernardino County;
2. Assess the group's engagement with social services; and,
3. Explore the barriers and facilitators of service use.



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SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY HOMELESSNESS INITIATIVES

Public Health Mobile Clinics

- June 2024: County purchased three mobile health clinics to provide onsite medical and dental services to County residents
- March 2025: dental equipment was upgraded to provide restorative services and more complex care
- Target areas which lack medical and dental facilities and populations who have limited access to care

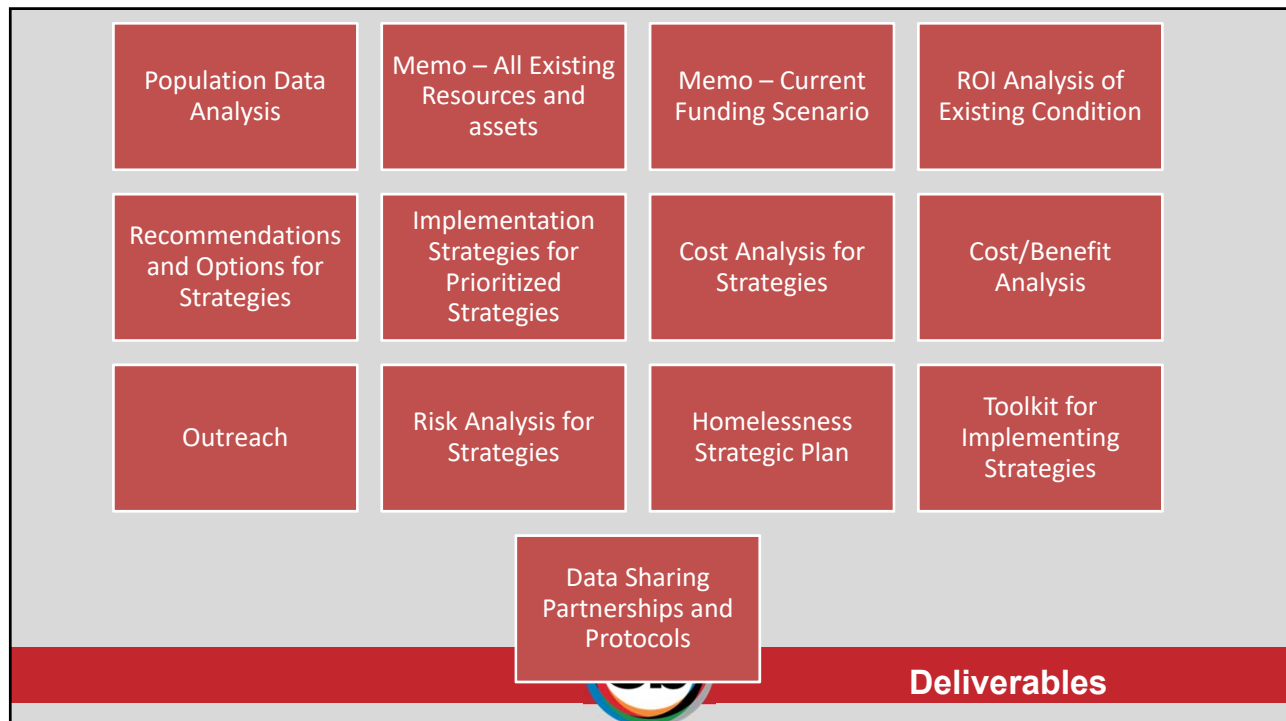
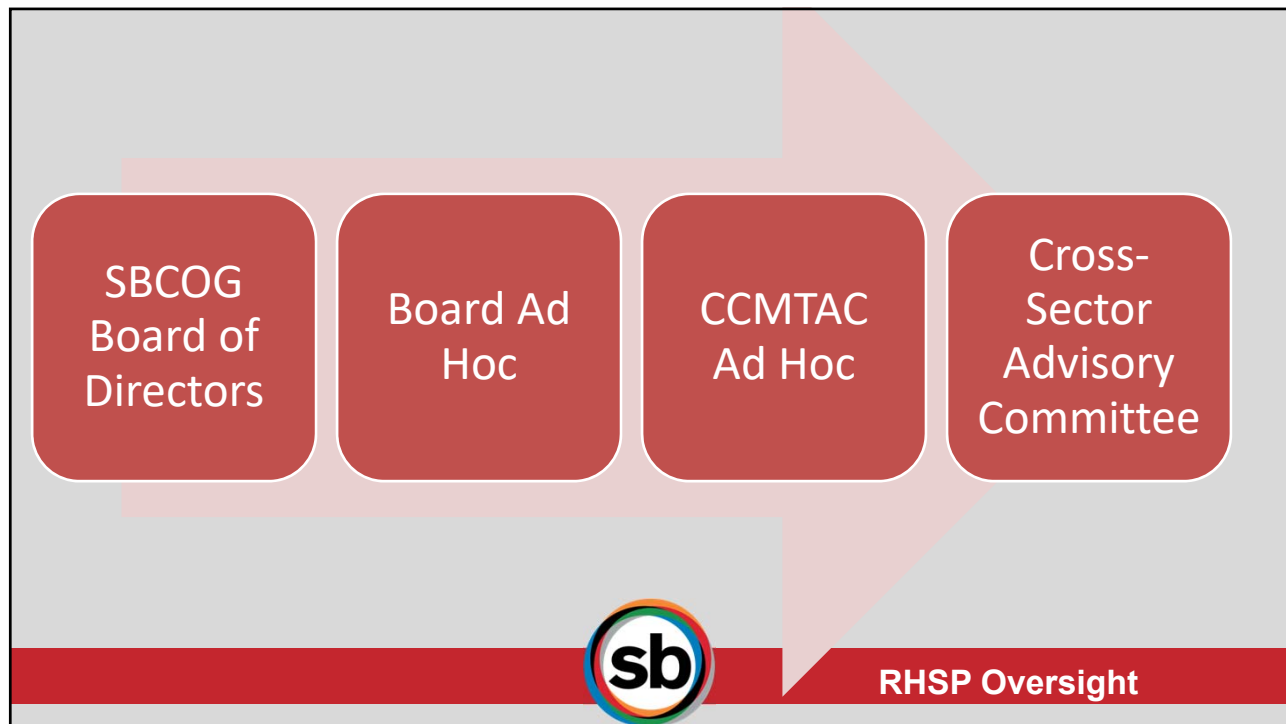
