## Metrolink Rolls Out New Fares

Metrolink has rolled out some changes designed to make riding the train more affordable and convenient. These include:

- **Monthly Pass Fare Reduction:** The price of a monthly pass has dropped by more than 10%. It remains the most cost-effective option for people who ride the train at least three times a week.
- **New Passes:** Metrolink is introducing a SoCal Day Pass that offers unlimited rides for \$10 on weekends and \$15 on weekdays. An LA Zone Pass is \$5 for rides all day between select stations near downtown Los Angeles.
- **Streamlining Pass Options:** The round-trip, 10-Day Flex and 7-Day pass options are discontinued. The 5-Day Flex Pass is still available.

In addition, the Student Adventure Pass program has been replaced with a 50% discount for students. Other everyday discounts haven't changed, and veterans now qualify for a 10% discount.
