- First Avenue Bridge Over BNSF Railroad Tracks Replacement of nearly 90-year-old steel truss bridge ,
 with upgraded concrete bridge designed to meet current
 vehicle and pedestrian ADA requirements.
- Lenwood Road Grade Separation –
 Construction of grade separation elevating Lenwood Road crossing over BNSF railroad tracks.
- Total Road Improvement Program (TRIP)
 Rimrock Road Replacement of pavement and widening of Rimrock Rd from Barstow Road, east to Dean Wash.

 Work also included concrete sidewalk and curb and gutter repairs, and upgrades on ADA ramps.
- Cameron Area –
 Replacement of pavement in streets, concrete sidewalk, curb
 and gutter repairs, and upgrades on ADA ramps in Central Barstow.
- Montara Area –
 Replacement of pavement in streets, concrete sidewalk, curb and gutter repairs, and upgrades on ADA ramps in East Barstow.

Current and Future

- Installation of Traffic Signal at Barstow and Rimrock Roads
- First Avenue Mojave River Bridge and Overflow Bridge –
 Replacement of existing bridges which have design and seismic deficiencies.
- West Section 7th Street Improvement Project Phase II and III –
 Replacement of existing paving and upgrading / widening street
 section with construction of concrete curbs and gutters.
- Pedestrian and Bicycle Corridor Project –
 Improvements to City streets and sidewalks as part of the
 "Safe Routes to Schools" and City's Active Transportation Program.
- Pavement Preservation and Rehabilitation Cameron Area.
- Rimrock Road Reconstruction Project –
 Pavement replacement on Rimrock Road from Barstow Road to Avenue H.
- Lenwood Road Reconstruction Project –
 Pavement replacement on Lenwood Road between Agate Road to railroad tracks.
